 - A. "I <u>BELIEVE</u> that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them; He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me_with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine

goodness and mercy without <u>ANY</u> merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to <u>THANK</u> and <u>PRAISE</u>, to <u>SERVE</u> and <u>OBEY</u> Him. This is most certainly true."

B. "I <u>BELIEVE</u> that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord; who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy precious blood and with His

 - Our teaching/leading/learning must be on <u>FAITH</u> raising based on the <u>GOD'S WORD!</u>
